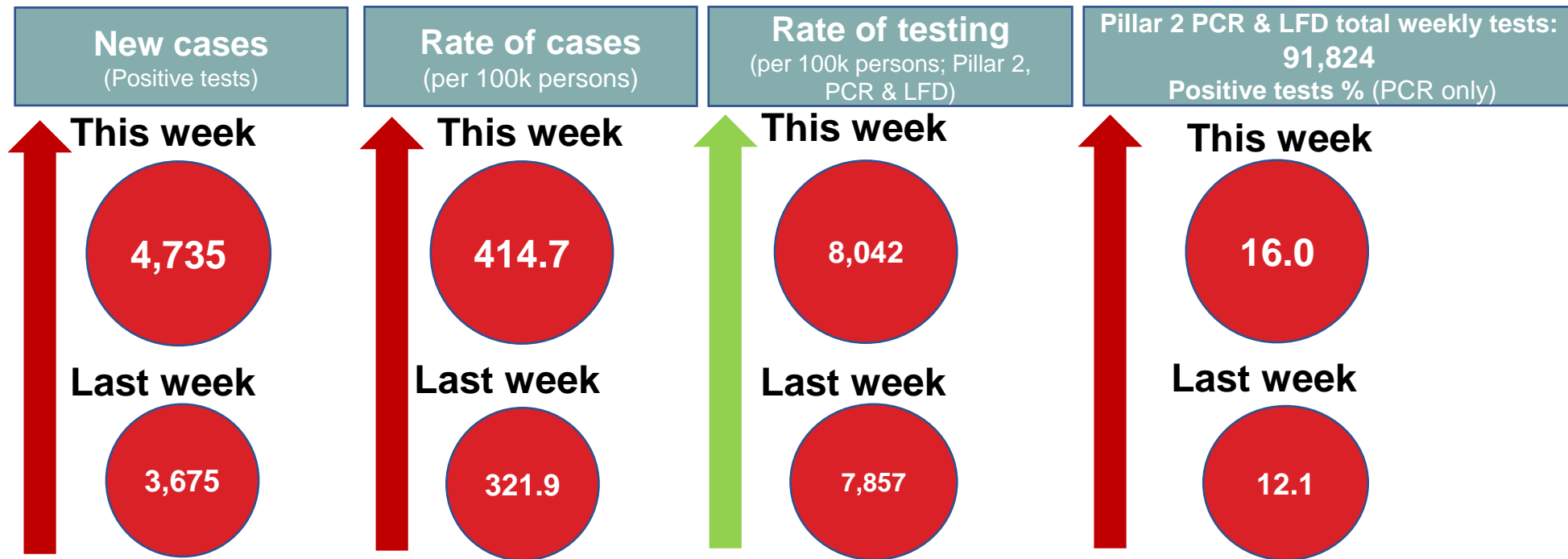

New cases continue to increase this week, along with overall case rates. The % of positive tests has also increased, as have the overall rates of testing using PCR, LFD or both.

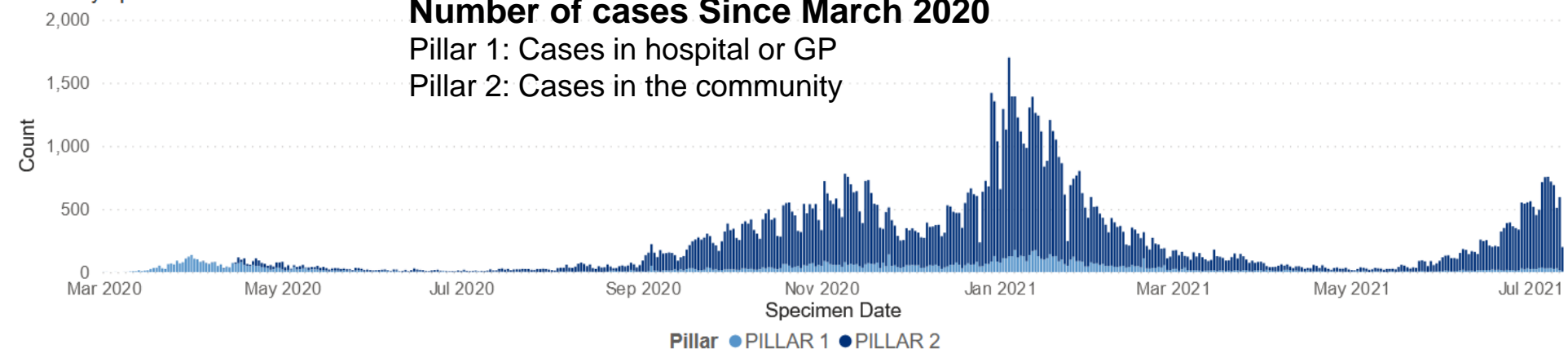
All adults who don't have symptoms should now be **testing twice a week** using the rapid lateral flow tests. Testing for asymptomatic individuals is now available [across the city](#) and you can also order test kits directly from the government for [free by post](#) or find a [local collection site](#).

Spread appears to be primarily occurring through household, social and workplace interactions. Spread often happens in the home but it isn't inevitable, and www.germdefence.org can help.

Hospital admissions range between 25 and 40 new cases a day for the week 05/07 - 11/07 across the hospitals in the city (total = 218), 42% higher than last week's numbers of between 14 and 36 new daily cases (total = 154). The average number of daily hospital admissions has been steadily increasing over the last month. There were 6 deaths from COVID-19 this week in Birmingham, up from 5 in the previous week.

Weekly report 5th to 11th July 2021

Across Birmingham, the number of cases increased by 1060 cases compared with last week (4,735 cases this week compared to 3,675 last week). All wards in Birmingham reported new cases this week.

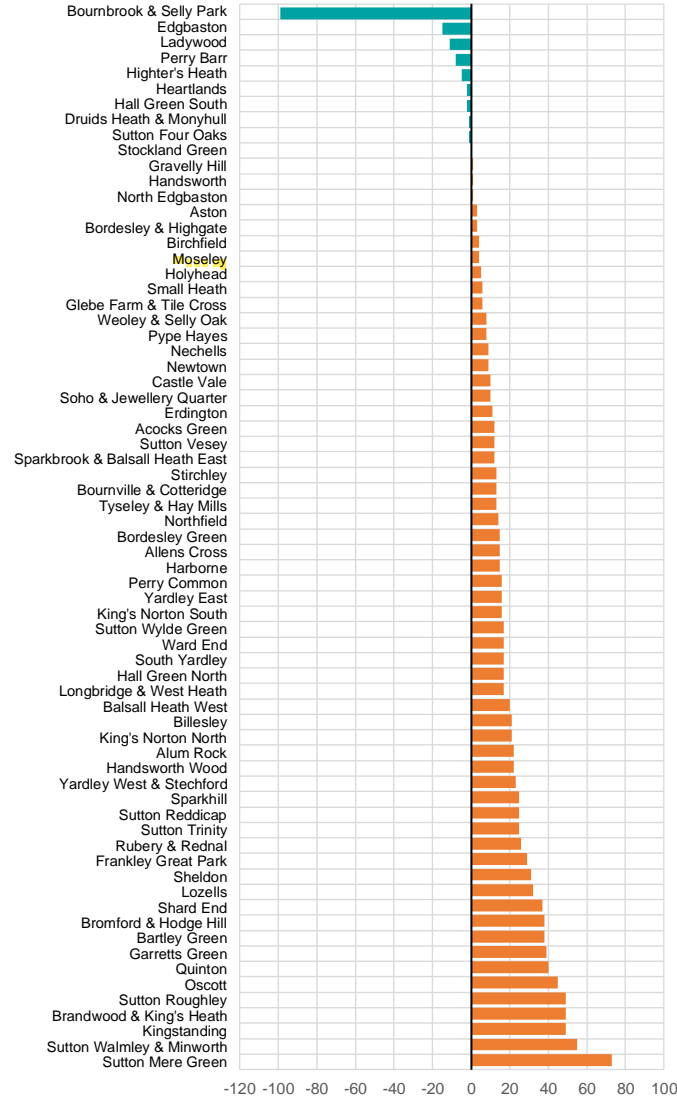
These are the wards with the highest case rates (cases per 100,000 population) this week:

Total cases rose in all age groups this week, most noticeably in the 40 – 59 age group (48%), the 60 – 79 age group (43%), and the 80+ age group (42%). They also increased in all ethnic groups, most noticeably the White population where it rose by 43% over the past week.

Change in weekly cases compared to the previous week



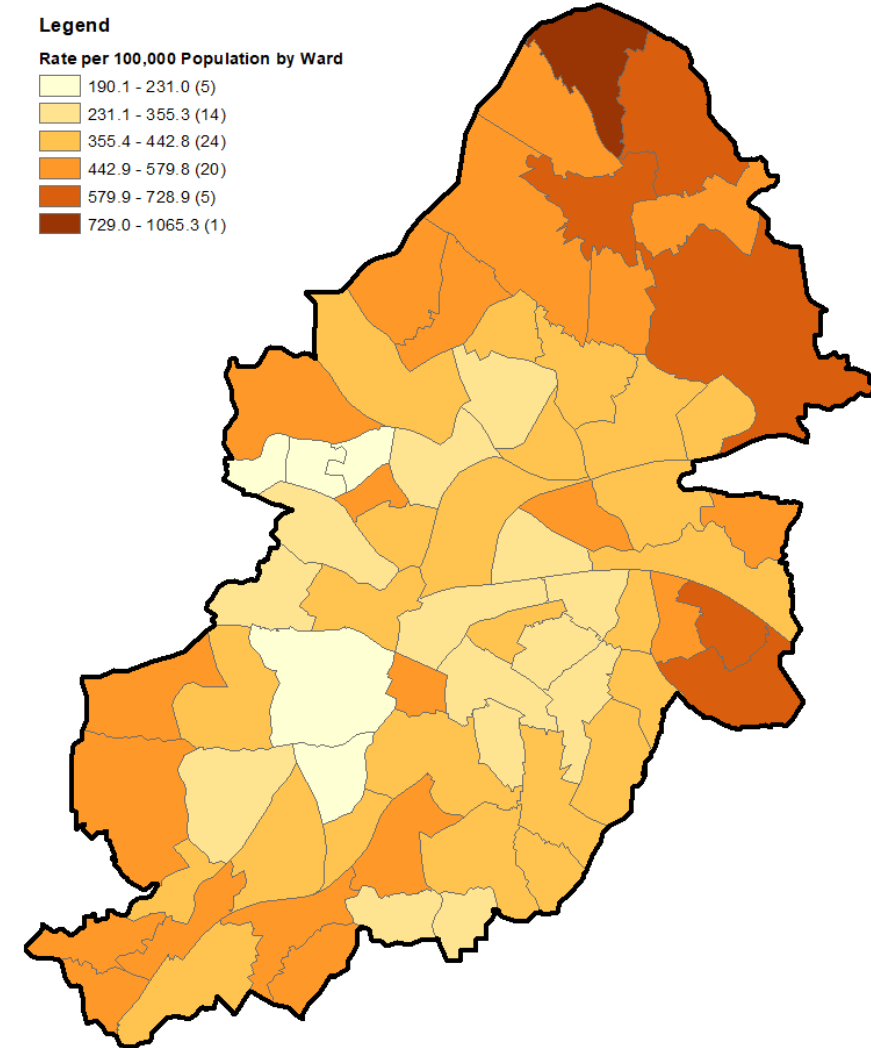
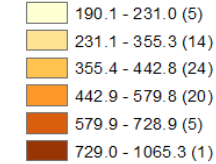
Comparison of seven-day total cases from 04 Jul to 11 Jul by wards level covering Birmingham.

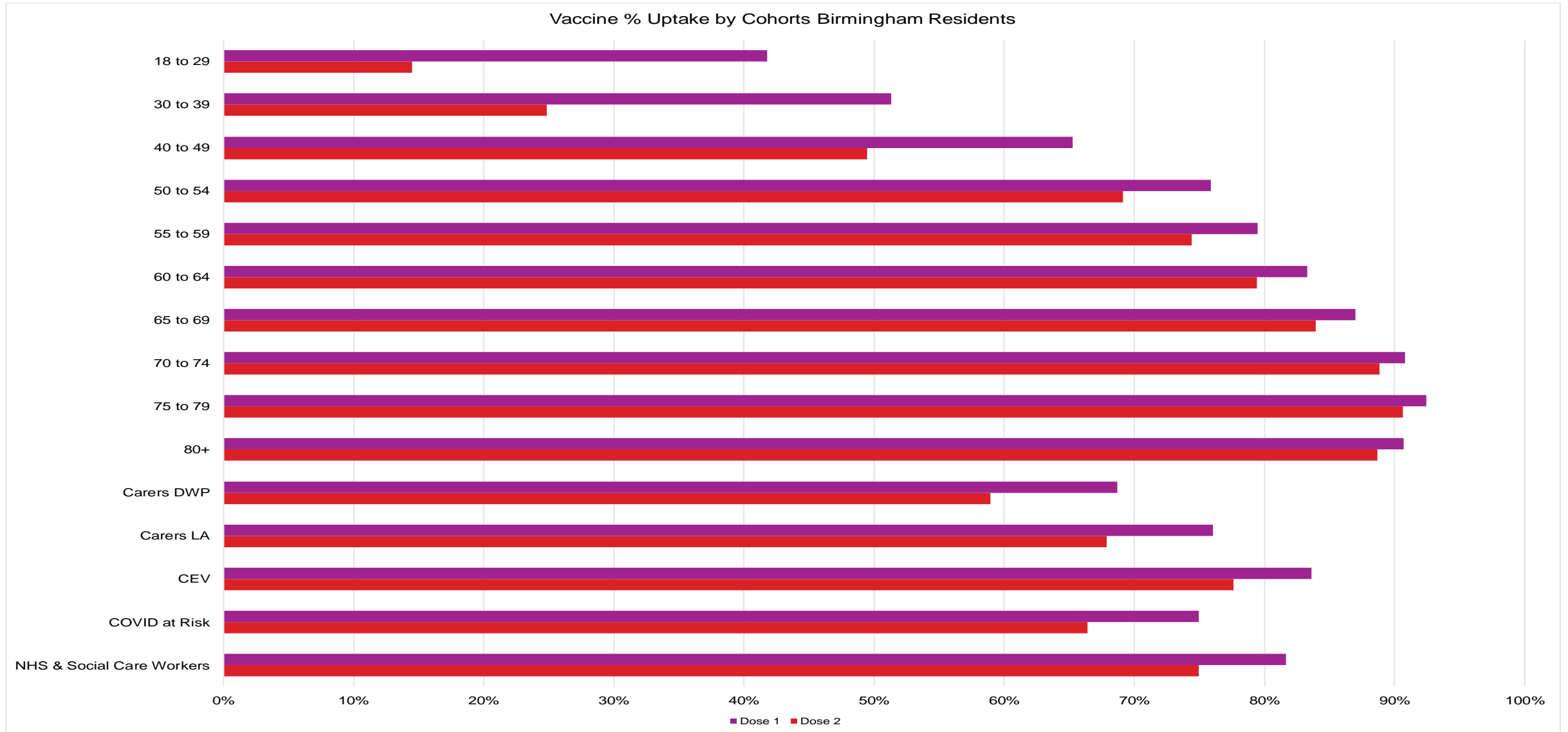
